Personal

A leading British international rider William has twice topped the world rankings (2008 & and been British number one seven times – he lost the accolade to Oliver Townend last year. He has won seven team gold and two individual silver medals at European championships as well as Olympic team silver (2004) and bronze (2008). He is one of only three riders to have won Burghley on five occasions and in 2004 achieved his ambition of winning Badminton. In 2008 he was the winner of the inaugural HSBC Classics Series.

William who gained a languages degree from London University, enjoys skiing during the off season. Both his parents Oliver and Marietta rode at Badminton and Marietta was in the British Team in the 1960's. He is married to Alice (Plunkett) a former four-star event rider and a now well known presenter of Channel 4 racing. The couple have two sons Oliver (4) and Thomas (3). They are based in Dorset where William has created a modern 24-box training yard.

Seacookie, a thoroughbred/trakehner was acquired from German international rider Ingrid Klimke in 2008. Cool Mountain, originally produced by Antionette McKeowen, is a former national novice champion who will be contesting his first four-star at Badminton.

With William Macchiato, an Argentinian thoroughbred, won the 2005 national intermediate championship, Bramham and Blair Castle in 2007 and in 2008 his first four-star at Luhmuhlen.
